

St. Rose of Lima Athletic Association Parent's Responsibilities

All parents of St. Rose of Lima Athletes are responsible for the following:

- 1) Parents must ensure the player has an updated physical on file with the school nurse prior to tryouts. Parents can obtain the "Medical History and Consent for Athletic Participation" form from the school or on the St. Rose of Lima website.
- 2) Parents shall advise the coach of any medical conditions of the child.
- 3) Parents must complete all required forms and pay the appropriate fees to the St. Rose of Lima Athletic Association.
- 4) Parents are responsible for making sure the player arrives for, and is picked up from, practices and games on time.
- 5) Parents must understand that players who are absent from school are not allowed to practice or play in a game that day.
- 6) If the child wears glasses, the parent must have the child's eye care professional complete the Statement regarding Eyewear (see the coach for a copy of this form or check on the St. Rose of Lima website).
- 7) Parents must make sure their child takes care of the uniform and returns the uniform on time (when requested in school), in good condition.
- 8) Parents are responsible for working either the concession stand, or providing assistance with field maintenance, if necessary. If a parent is unable to make it for their assigned date, they must make their own arrangements for a replacement.
- 9) Parents must behave in a sportsmanlike manner at all games. They are responsible for controlling their own, and their family's, behavior at St. Rose of Lima sporting events.
- 10) Parents and families must follow all "Rules of the Gym", which are posted in the gym and on the St. Rose of Lima website. Parents must clean up after themselves and their family members at St. Rose of Lima sporting events.
- 11) Parents are requested to provide feedback to the Executive Board of the St. Rose of Lima Athletic Association regarding their child's experience in the St. Rose of Lima sports program. (Refer to the parent survey form distributed at the end of the season.)
- 12) If a parent has a grievance about a specific sport, the grievance must be presented first to the individual coach. If the issue is not resolved, the parent may present the issue, in writing, to the Director of Coaches. If necessary, the issue shall then be brought to the attention of the Chairman of the Executive Board of the St. Rose of Lima Athletic Association
